Seminar Statement

This seminar explores issues related to gender and sexuality, as well as their intersections with other social locations—including race, class, nation, and religion—in Francophone contexts across the globe. In addition to examining specific social, cultural, and political expressions of gender and sexuality in their various local dimensions, this course also interrogates how theorizing on these questions critically engages (or not) with practices of knowledge production that tend to marginalize non-western perspectives. It also takes into consideration how scholars working in Francophone contexts navigate the complex debates about the cultural and scientific influence of North American and Metropolitan

France on gender and sexuality. Students will engage in independent and original reflection and are encouraged to find connections to their own research.
